
Easy Read

Crime in your local area

This part of the survey is about crime in your **local area**.

Your **local area** includes your street, neighbourhood and the area you live in.



Question 1: Which kinds of crime affect your local area the most?

Murder and manslaughter .
Manslaughter is when a person kills someone else, but did not mean to kill them.
Sexual crimes, like forcing someone to have sex or sharing illegal sexual pictures online.
Crimes to do with weapons, like knives and guns.

Robbery - This is stealing someone's things by using force.
Theft - This is stealing someone's things, without using force.

Damaging things and setting things on fire.

Harassment is behaviour that bothers or upsets someone.
Stalking is when someone keeps harassing or following you, when you do not want them to.
Public order offences - these are things like violence or anti-social behaviour in public places.



Out of 5, how safe do you feel at home in the day?






Out of 5, how safe do you feel at home at night?




Out of 5, how safe do you feel outside in your local area in the day?


